






CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

A/Prof Mike Beckmann Director of Mothers Babies and Women's Health, Mater Misericordiae Ltd MBBS FRANZCOG PhD

Mike Beckmann has been with the Mater for 13 years, initially in the role of Staff Specialist, and then Director of




Mike is a Fellow of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, and holds a Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery as well as Doctor of Philosophy from The University of Queensland. He holds the positions of Senior Staff Specialist Obstetrician and Gynaecologist, Betty McGrath Research Fellow, College Examiner, and Associate Professor at the University of Queensland School of Medicine.

As well as Clinical Stream Leader, he is an active clinician and a researcher. His major research focus is induction of labour. His PhD thesis was on the topic of "Induction Labour using Prostaglandin" and Mike is now leading a national multi-centre trial comparing induction of labour as an inpatient and an outpatient. He has authored and co-authored more than 60 research publications, and is co-supervising several PhD students in the areas of surgical simulation, team dynamics, consumer information-sharing, and the health economics of surgical site infection.

in children, and is currently completing his fellowship in chemical pathology through the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia.

Director, Australian Longitudinal Study on Women's Health | Head, Epidemiology and Biostatistics Division

Gita Mishra is an NHMRC Principal Research Fellow and Professor of Life Course Epidemiology at the School of Public Heath, University of Queensland. She is Director of the Australian Longitudinal Study on Womens Health, a major national study running since 1996 that has informed development of policy related to women's health. Prof Mishra also leads the InterLACE project, a major international consortium on reproductive health and chronic disease.

She is internationally recognised for her contribution to research on life course epidemiology and women's health. Her specific focus is on the factors that affect reproductive health from menarche to menopause, and the influence of reproductive health across the life course. She has more than 300 peer-reviewed scientific papers and book chapters, including as co-editor of a key academic textbook on Family Based Studies. In 2017, she was presented an honorary membership of Sigma International, a global nursing organisation, for her contribution to women's health and was elected as a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences (FAHMS). In 2018, she led a successful application for an NHMRC Centre for Research Excellence on Women and Non-Communicable Disease (CRE-WaND).
