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CODE OF ETHICS

Members of the Australasian Institute for Restorative Reproductive Medicine in clinical practice agree to all the provisions made hereunder.

- 1. Members will provide and promote treatments that seek to cooperate with or restore normal or optimal functioning of the human reproductive system.
- 2. Members will only provide and promote investigations and treatments aiming to improve reproductive health and infertility that are undertaken in a way that is respectful both of human life and of the dignity of all the participants.
- 3. Members will avoid treatments that seek to suppress, circumvent, or destroy functioning of the human reproductive system.
- 4. The human being is to be respected and treated as a human person with the inviolable and inalienable right to life, from formation of the zygote and thus inception of new life.
- 5. Treatments or investigations intended to cure or alleviate a present or potential serious pathology which present a risk to an unborn human life or to the fertility of the woman may be permitted after consideration of proportionality of that risk, with the intent that any harm to the unborn child is neither the intended goal nor a means to the treatment goal.
- 6. Members will represent only AIRRM-approved protocols and activities as being connected with AIRRM.
- 7. Conduct, cooperation and participation in research on behalf of AIRRM must reflect all the ethical principles contained in this code and be approved by the local institutional ethics committee.
- 8. Members will maintain professional standards including registration, continuing professional development and scope of practice as relevant to their profession.

Members of AIRRM who are not in clinical practice agree to abide by and promote all the provisions of this Code provided above.
